What do I bring to class?

Miscellaneous Information

- Assignments, quizzes and tests MUST be completed in PENCIL. No credit given if done in pen.
- Late papers will NOT be accepted but are expected to be completed. No work results in a <u>Zero.</u>
- Papers without work shown will <u>NOT</u> be accepted and <u>CANNOT</u> be turned in late for credit.
- Legible handwriting. If I cannot read your work, credit will not be given and assignments will need to be done again.
- Assignment book should be completed Daily!
- If you are absent it is your responsibility to find out what was missed, to arrange for its completion, and to turn the work in. I follow the guidelines of out one day, one day given to turn in absent work. I will not accept it for credit after that time.
- If you are unsure about an assignment, please check my website.
- If you miss my class due to a field trip/school function, it is your responsibility to get the assignment ahead of time. The assignment is due the next day.
- Once a time and day have been arranged for a make-up of a quiz/test, the student is expected to arrive on time with all supplies and materials.

Homework Grades!

Homework grades will be entered into Pinnacle by date assigned but they are <u>NOT</u> calculated into the homework grade until the end of the unit. These grades are <u>NOT</u> averaged. Homework is considered part of the learning process and either earns or does not earn credit on the due date. You should see one of the following three entries per assignment.

- 0 = homework was not completed, was not completed with an acceptable level of quality, or student did not have the assignment in class to turn in. Credit not earned.
- Blank = student was absent and assignment should be completed, checked, and turned in according to the policy, "The number of days absent equals the number of day until due date of absent work once student returns to school." This will convert to a "0" if policy guidelines are not met.
- Any other value indicates the percent earned on the homework assignment. Each of the three flowing areas is averaged for the final grade. The value of each area of work is as follows:

How will I be graded?

Homework = weight of 1 (17 % of grade) Quizzes = weight of 2 (33% of grade) Tests = weight of 3 (50% of grade)

Quarterly Effort Score Based on Number of HW Zeroes

0-1 Zeroes: "1" 4-5 Zeroes: "3" 10+ Zeroes "5" 2-3 Zeroes: "2" 6-9 Zeroes: "4"

Any score(s) of 3 or higher will disqualify a student from the Citizenship Award at the end of the year.


When may I use my calculator?

I will let you know when it is okay to use your calculator. You will need to use your calculator daily to calculator your homework score. You will also be able to use your calculator for most of the chapters. Please ask if you're not sure.

How often will we have homework?

There will be homework most days.

- 1) YOU MUST WRITE IN PENCIL or you will not receive credit.
- 2) For all assignments, you must:
- Show ALL steps/work and put a box around your answer.
- Use a correct label, if needed, and answer word problems using complete sentences.
- You may do your work on another sheet of paper. If you do your work on a separate paper you must copy the problem.



Are there any other policies, or procedures I need to know about?

Yes, there are some basic rules and courtesies we all need to follow to make the classroom a comfortable and productive place.

- 1) Do not say or do anything hurtful or disruptive to another student or the teacher.
- 2) Follow directions. If you are asked to do something, and you don't follow directions, or you are hurtful or disruptive as you are attempting to follow directions, you will be asked to spend the rest of the class period working by yourself at a designated location. Further disruptions will result in detention or an office referral.
- 3) Do not talk or leave your seat when anyone is addressing the class.
- Be ready to work when the bell rings. You may be counted tardy if you are not in your seat. Sharpen your pencil BEFORE class.
