Dear Parents.

As you know our PTO had a very successful fundraiser this year. The funds raised through the 2018-2019 Fun Run were earmarked for the Ferry library. The library is one of only a handful of spaces at Ferry Elementary that truly services all K-5 students, as well as teachers/staff and the community. It is often our school's first impression to visitors as they attend Kindergarten Information Night, a PTO meeting, or other community events/meetings. Access to technology is an important aspect of learning and succeeding in the 21st Century and it's a criteria by which schools are now evaluated. The PTO supports the need to modernize Ferry Elementary's library.

In evaluating where to allocate its budget, the PTO considers the number of students impacted, with a priority toward improved technology and building a sense of community.

The media center vision for Ferry Elementary would provide more shared access to technology and a flexible environment to effectively use the technology. The library is small and the PTO recognizes the need for more functional equipment, providing fluid transition between group learning, individual reading and technology-rich areas.

With that being said, the PTO is hard at work reviewing the budget and working with Ms. Martin and me to prioritize the purchases for the library that will support the vision described above. We are hopeful that you will see the transformation of our library during this school year!



School Closing Information

Here are some of the factors that are taken into consideration to close schools in Winter days:

- Actual temperature and wind chills
- Amount and type of snow
- When the snow falls, and when the snowfall is expected to end
- Ability to clear parking lots and sidewalks around school
- Freezing rain and the effect on roads, power lines and tree limbs
 All of these factors are reviewed in total, taking into account the fact that the Grosse Pointe municipalities and our facilities staff do an outstanding job of clearing streets, sidewalks and parking lots. Learning Spanish

My name is Sra. Grattan, and I have the pleasure of teaching Spanish at Ferry this year! We just finished our first rotation together, and it was so lovely getting to know the students and staff.

Our third graders learned how to greet others, describe their feelings, and describe what they are like. Students created a Spanish "Vote for Me!" poster as part of an imaginary class election, and participated in several Spanish stories. They can also talk about their age and their favorite colors! Students finished their rotation with a lesson on Frida Kahlo, a Mexican artist, and created their own self-portrait with information about themselves surrounding it.

Fourth graders learned about the Spanish calendar and weather, which will carry into planning our imaginary trip to Peru throughout the course of the year. We learned about two major cities in Peru, Cusco and Lima, and talked about what the seasons and weather are like there. Students also began a clothing unit, during which we helped our character pack appropriate clothing for her trip to Peru.

Our fifth graders learned about the history and culture of Spain, which we will be tying into all of our units this year. We discussed our community and communities in Spain, and we learned how to give directions. Students then learned how to describe their house, playing games and listening to stories to practice rooms. They also created blueprints of their ideal apartments in Spain, and finished by helping catch a robber in a Spanish story. • Together is Better: Creatively cooperate with others.


Habit 7: Sharpen the Saw


MUSIC

Let's Read allows you to create personalized picture book experiences for your kids by the people who love them the most! Let's Read provides a fun, easy way to record video & audio narrations for your kids. The app synchronizes your video/audio recordings with the illustrations from an award-winning collection of picture books. Let's Read was originally conceived by a media researcher to create healthy screen-time that children would love to play. Imagine your child with his/her own digital bookshelf filled with personalized stories recorded just for her by mom and dad, aunts, uncles, grandparents and even family friends too! Age 4+. Available for iPhone and iPad. Cost is FREE.



The Infinite Arcade by Tinybop. Make and play your own games! Share them with friends! Make platformer games, adventure games, pinball games, ball and paddle games, text puzzlers, and mazes. Create your own characters! Make games with zombie mobs, hot lava, disco bricks, crystal geysers, trampoline tiles, oil slicks, wandering stars, and more. So many parts to create your games with! Infinite Arcade is a game construction kit. It's the fourth app in Tinybop's Digital Toys series which includes the iPad App of the Year, The Robot Factory. Digital Toys apps are designed to let kids create anything they can imagine. Age 4+. Available for iPhone and iPad. Cost is \$2.99.



Hoopa City 2 starts out slowly, with green grass, a blue sky, and a short strip of road. As kids explore, tap, and build a few roads, other building tools are added, two at a time, until kids can build with love, money, energy, roads, bricks, water, and nature as well as remove what they build with a shovel. Each tool, used alone, builds something distinct -- bricks build houses; love builds hospitals -- but the tools can be combined to build a variety of buildings. Kids explore and discover just what can be built and create a whole world. For kids, simply creating their own little worlds is certainly entertaining and valuable play, but Hoopa City becomes mind-blowingly fun as kids figure out all the building possibilities.
