
Dear Parents.

Our Leader in Me Journey continues this year thanks to support from The Grosse Pointe Foundation for Public Education. This year we will continue to learn, teach and practice the 7 Habits. Our new focus, "Create a Leadership Culture". You may have noticed changes to our physical environment. As you enter from the bike rack doors, you see "Live, Laugh, Learn, Leave a Legacy". This is our mission for Ferry School and all who enter our doors. We cherish our history, value our students and staff both past and present, and strive to create a culture in which together we live, laugh, learn, and leave our own legacy. You will also noticed our 7 Habits tree as you walk up the main stairway. Staff members worked together over the summer to start the transformation of our physical environment. This is only the beginning! We look forward to including parents and students as the transformation continues.

We also have made strides in expanding student leadership roles. This year we started an application process for various leadership opportunities. In addition to Service, Safety, and Green Team, Ms. Flanagan and Mrs. Balderson have established a Student Lighthouse Team. Mrs. Lassiter and Ms. Moores are sponsoring a Nature Club. Ms. Judy Griffith is starting a Photography Club. Mrs. Brumme is overseeing the Recess Leaders and PE Posse. Ms. Martin works daily with our Broadcast Team. In addition, every child has a classroom leadership role. It is wonderful to see the excitement and commitment our students are displaying in their new roles. Habit 3: Put First Things First Work First, Then Play: Live by your values and beliefs.

Habit 4: Think Win-Win, Everyone Can Win: Think mutual benefit with others. One

person's success is not achieved at the expense of others." - Stephen R. Covey

Habit 5: Seek First to Understand, Then to Be Understood Listen Before You Talk: Seek to understand others and to be understood by others.

Habit 6: Synergize Together is Better: Creatively cooperate with others.

Habit 7: Sharpen the Saw, Balance Feels Best: Continuously renew your body, brain, heart, and soul.

When parents encourage learning and living the 7 Habits they are teaching their children to respect diversity while always acting with integrity to their own principles and values.



A BRIEF SUMMARY OF FERRY'S COMMUNITY SUCCESS PLAN


The Ferry Community Success Plan is based on the philosophy of Conscious Discipline developed by Dr. Becky Bailey. This brain smart philosophy guides children to be in control of their own emotions and behavior so that they can build positive relationships with others. It involves 7 skills and classroom structures that facilitate a safe environment where children can learn.

In 2016, Ferry's staff adopted the "Leader in Me" philosophy of Dr. Stephen R. Covey. Dr. Covey's extensive research into what makes people most effective led to the development of



the 7 Habits of Highly
Effective People.
Eventually a system of
teaching these habits to
children was developed
called "The Leader in Me".
Schools that have adopted

The Leader in Me "have



seen marked improvements in the culture, the confidence of students, and the engagement of staff and parents, as well a reductions in discipline problems" (p.10 Launching Leadership).

Discipline at Ferry School means using common language with procedures and behavior expectations which focuses on the positive and uses natural consequences. Teaches will use Ferry´s Behavior Expectation Matrix and the Student Behavior Intervention Flow chart. Strategies include: Clip chart, Habit High Fives, data collection using Mi-Star Q, S3 and Tier 2 processes, ratio of 4 positive to 1 negative teacher/student interactions, and referral procedures.



Ferry staff and students are so excited to be back at school and right back into our Leader in Me journey!

Last year, students were taught the 7 Habits:

1.) Be Proactive

2.) Begin with the End in Mind

3.) Put First Things First

4.) Think Win-Win

5.) Seek First to Understand, Then to Be Understood

6.) Synergize

7.) Sharpen the Saw

As the school year started, classes spent time discussing what a "leader" is, establishing classroom routines and expectations, and crafting mission statements. A mission statement outlines our purpose for coming to school each day. A classroom mission statement reminds us to be a team player, work to our potential, always be prepared and respectful, and make the most of each school day. Have you ever considered writing a family mission statement? It may be a quality dinnertime discussion to talk about your family's purpose, values, and goals for leaving a legacy! In September, students and teachers focused on Habit 1: Be Proactive and Habit 2: Begin with the End in Mind. When we are proactive, we have a "can-do" attitude. We choose our actions, attitudes, and moods. Being proactive means always doing the right thing, even when no one is looking. Proactive students are kind, respectful, and responsible. When we begin with the end in mind, we make a plan and set goals. We

think about the future, and we work towards accomplishing steps towards our "end in mind." This may mean, children share what they want to be when they grow up, and think about what they can do now and today, as elementary students, to one day reach successfully their dreams. In October, students are focusing on Habits 3, 4, 5, and 6.
