Thank you for a wonderful school year! As we begin to plan for next year there is staffing information I would like to share with you.

We have several retirements this year. Mrs. Davisson, Mrs. Mestdagh, and Mrs. Sevin are all retiring at the end of the year. Ms. Orhan will also be leaving us to join the Trombly staff as a 5th grade teacher. There is no doubt they will be missed! Mrs. Anne Reinhard from Monteith will be taking the 4th grade teaching position. Mrs. Karen Aldrich from Richard will be taking the 5th grade position. Our current teachers have worked with these individuals in the past and have shared nothing but positive comments. We are all very excited to welcome them to the Ferry staff. At this time I do not know who our music teacher will be.

There are other changes that are occurring. Next year we are fortunate to have 3 sections of kindergarten. Ms. Tyler, our current 2/3 magnet teacher will be our third kindergarten teacher. Prior to teaching magnet, Ms. Tyler taught first grade and is now pursuing her masters in early childhood. She will be a wonderful addition to our kindergarten team. Mr. Kirk Saddlemeir will be coming from Kerby to teach our 2/3 magnet. Kirk has a keen understanding of the needs of our gifted students. He is a broad thinker, is dedicated to project based learning and has taught first and second grade. He too will be a wonderful addition to the Ferry staff.

Room changes will occur as a result of the third section of kindergarten. Ms. Tyler will remain in her current classroom as kindergarten teacher. The 2/3 magnet classroom will be moved to room 110, Ms. Listwan's current classroom. Ms. Listwan will move upstairs to room 208 (Mrs. Davisson's old room.) Mrs. Reinhard will be in room 206 and Mrs. Aldrich will be in room 201.

ATTENTION: FAMILIES OF FIFTH AND EIGHTH GRADE STUDENTS

Effective Immediately

The Board of Education feels strongly about enforcing our residency requirements and not opening our district to School of Choice options. Rather than incur the cost of a total district reregistration, the administration is performing a **total re-verification of students entering sixth and ninth grades**. Families who have already verified their address this school year due to an address change are exempt from this process.

At <u>www.gpschools.org</u> under Residency and Enrollment on the Residency Re-Verifications page you will find more information about the documents required for this process. You must bring all the required original documents with you. We encourage you to come to the Administration Building at 389 St. Clair Avenue, Grosse Pointe **before August 1**. The office hours are: 8:00 am - 4:00 pm Monday through Thursday and 8:00 am - 3:30 pm on Friday. Questions may directed to Joi M. Neely at 313-432-3083, option 2.

Class assignments will not be shared in August if you have not completed this re-verification process.

Please remember, that only one parent/legal guardian must reside within the district for their child to legally attend our schools. Students found to be attending without meeting residency requirements, are removed immediately.

This is one more method to assure our community that the children in our buildings are our students.
