### PRINCIPAL MESSAGE



Dear Parents,

December is upon us! Report Cards will be coming home on Tuesday, Along with your December 4th. child's report card you will receive a Cumulative Assessment Report. The Assessment Report provides information from standardized test that your child takes each year. This information, used in connection with reports of progress, daily work, conferences and other assessments, can be a useful tool in tracking your child's academic progress. When reviewing this information it is best to look for patterns of If you have achievement and growth over time. questions about this information please feel free to contact your child's teacher or me.





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Also during the month of December, Ferry staff and students are working on Wildly Important Goals or (WIGS) as part of Leader In Me. There are 4 dimensions to successfully achieving goals:

- 1. Focus on the Wildly Important
  - a. What is important to me? Where am I now? Where do I want to be by when?
- 2. Establish and Act on the Lead Measures
  - a. What actions can I take to help me achieve my WIG?
  - b. Pick actions/strategies that are doable and will make a difference.
- 3. Keep a Compelling Scoreboard
  - a. Make a scoreboard and post it where everyone can see it
  - b. Include a calendar or tally chart for tracking lead measures
  - c. Add a graph to chart your progress over time
- 4. Create a Cadence of Accountability
  - a. Find a partner to update and review your scoreboard
  - b. Did I meet my commitment
  - c. Celebrate

Ask your child about their classroom, personal or academic goals. The link I have included is an example of a WIG planner. Your child may even want to help you in establishing a family goal. <u>Goal Planner</u>. The goal planner can also be a great conversation starter between you and your child in reviewing information on their Report Card and Cumulative Assessment Report.

## **Family Mission Statements**

Mission statements have long been a part of organizations; they provide a clear path for what the organization wants to accomplish and how they plan to go about doing it. Yet, seldom does a family take the time to write a mission statement, and what organization is more important than the family? By establishing who you are as a family, how you want to be known, and how you plan to do it, you are practicing Habit 2: Begin With the End in Mind<sup>®</sup>. The process is a great way to practice all of the 7 Habits.

### Step 1.

Ask yourself these seven questions: How do we want our family to be known? How do we want to treat each other? What is most important to us as a family? What are some of our talents, gifts, and abilities? What makes us the happiest? What makes us unhappy? What kind of home do we want to invite friends to?

### Step 2.

Write your Family Mission Statement. Consider all four areas:

- Body (health and physical welfare)
- Brain (learning)
- Heart (relationships)
- Soul (inspiration)

Keep it simple, one to two lines, so the youngest family members can memorize it and find it meaningful. Examples: "We are builders," "No empty chairs," "To serve others," "All for one and one for all," etc.

### Step 3.

Stay on course. As parents, you are the role models. Keep smiling and getting back on track. The promise: By writing a Family Mission Statement, the message to your children is that your family is important—you know what you stand for and how you are going to work together to accomplish it.




