- Students will now be tested in third grade for reading proficiency using a state assessment.
- Parents will be notified if the third grade students are not reading proficient.
- Testing will start with the 2019-20 3rd grade students.

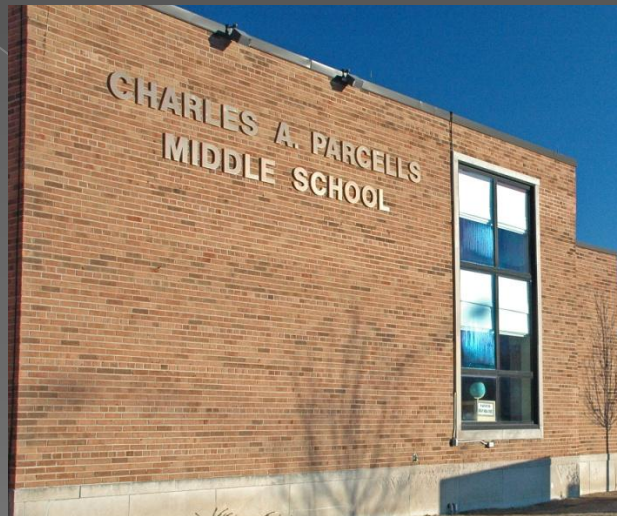

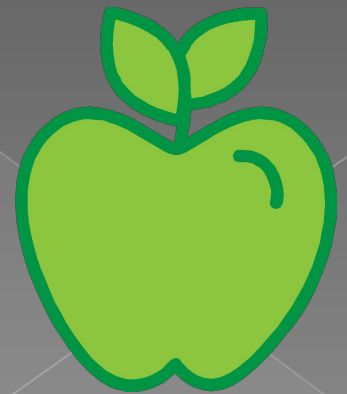

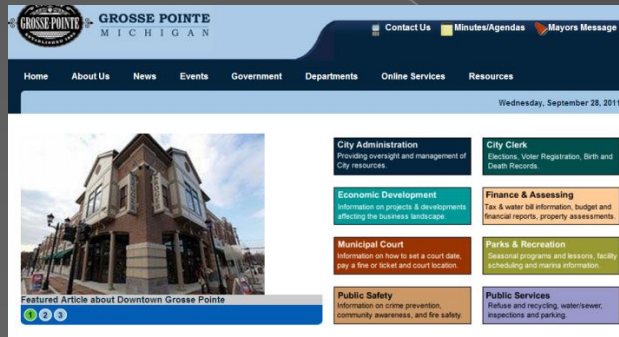
