**M-Step Testing:** Over the next 6 weeks of school, we will be taking our 1<sup>st</sup> Annual MSTEP State Testing. The MSTEP will be replacing the MEAP Test, traditionally given in the fall. From April 13<sup>th</sup> – 24<sup>th</sup>, Eighth Grade students will be tested in Reading, Math, and Social Studies. From April 27<sup>th</sup> – May 8<sup>th</sup>, our Seventh Graders will be testing in Reading, Math, and Science. Finally, our Sixth Grade students will be tested in Reading and Math from May 19<sup>th</sup> – 29<sup>th</sup>. Please make sure that your student gets a good night's sleep, eats a healthy breakfast, and is at school on time during our testing days.

### Happy Spring!

As you may have heard, our spring testing calendar has been lengthened this year due to changes with the MDE's new annual assessment, the **M-STEP** (Michigan Student Test of Educational Progress). Changes with the test include a writing performance task in Math and ELA sections at each grade level. Our Math and English teachers have been preparing students this semester for such changes. Other changes include our 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade ACT Explore test, which is now titled **ACT Aspire**. This assessment will be similar to the version administered in previous years. Our teachers have also begun integrating concepts into their instruction to prepare students for this assessment.

Students will be placed in grade level testing locations (and will not be testing in their P3 classes). We will communicate these locations with our students prior to Spring Break and will have easy to view posters placed in our hallways. We strongly encourage you to view our website for specific information regarding our testing calendar and testing locations for each grade level. ## SOCIAL STUDIES NEWS



6<sup>th</sup> grade: Students in the fourth quarter will be studying the European continent.

**7**<sup>th</sup> **grade**: Students have studied Economic, Russia, and World Religions third quarter. Honors classes completed a research project on a world religion and presented their findings in a creative booklet format. They were able to share their projects with each other in class as we turned the classroom into a "coffee house." It was complete with tablecloths, candle lit tables, coffee, tea, and hot chocolate. Students brought in cookies and brownies to enjoy with their hot beverages.

8<sup>th</sup> grade: Students in Mr. Palen's class finished their study of the Industrial Revolution in America. Students viewed clips from Charlie Chaplin's *Modern Times* and Fritz Lange's *Metropolis* to get a better understanding of how the Industrial Revolution affected mankind. Next in class, we are turning our attention to westward expansion and how the United States evolved over the first half of the nineteenth century. Students in Ms. Miller's class just completed an evidence based argumentative essay that required them to use historical documents in order to answer the question, *Did the Alien and Sedition Acts violate the Constitution?* This was a difficult task, but they did it!

<u>Social Studies Olympiad</u>: Students are putting their final touches on their individual projects and are submitting them to the state competition at the end of this month. The Social Studies Olympiad quiz bowl team recently "scrimmaged" against the faculty at our pep assembly. The teachers prevailed but it was nice for the SSO kids to showcase their knowledge and love of trivia in front of our student body. The quiz bowl team is gearing up for their competition May 16<sup>th</sup> at Okemos High School.

spent the past 12 months studying for this year's competition. Her hard work certainly paid off! We wish her luck at the State Tournament in April!



# **English News**



March has been an exciting time in Language Arts, and this has been especially true with our 6<sup>th</sup> grade classes. The fourth quarter is upon us!

Narrative classes continue to trudge up Mount Everest with the study of Peak.

Mrs. Kifer's Reading Essentials classes have entered the digital age with Digital Writer's Workshop. Students are using Google Docs to type their persuasive essays and peer-revise using collaboration and digital comments. Some students have used an "add-on" called Kaizena Mini to record comments and listen to teacher recommendations for their papers.

Mr. McDonald's Reading Essentials classes are piloting a new novel. *Close to Famous* is one of the more recent novels from Newberry Award-winning author Joan Bauer. Published in 2011, the book follows Foster McKee, an aspiring chef, and her mother as they leave Memphis and settle in the small town of Culpepper, West Virginia. It's a feel-good piece of contemporary fiction that features likeable characters who overcome obstacles to push towards their goals.

A large portion of student evaluation deals with turning the novel into a smaller "graphic novel" that each student creates to display understanding of plot, setting and characterization. All students also feel *Close to Famous* will one day make an excellent film.



The runs begin on Monday, April 13. Students should report to room 205 by 3:30 dressed to run. We run in rain, sun, wind, snow, and cold – dress appropriately.

Permission slips must be turned in before they can run with the club. The Parcells Club Fee of \$50 must also be paid. Remember, the Club Fee is paid only once and is good for all clubs during the school year.

## Your Grosse Pointe Public Library

The Grosse Pointe Public School System is grateful for its many community partnerships. To ensure we remain good neighbors with our partners in the Grosse Pointe Library System, we would like to take this opportunity to remind patrons of rules that will help us all utilize this community resource to its fullest potential.

Just as in school, there are guidelines for behavior and supervision at our local libraries. The library has a document entitled "Guidelines on Behavior" that will be enforced. It is available for review at the Youth Desk, but here are a few highlights we would appreciate your help in maintaining:

#### **Visiting the Library**

We encourage all patrons to work together in order to ensure a safe, positive learning environment. Loitering outside the library, or excessive entrance and exit, is disruptive to this environment which is designed to support study, reading and other quiet activities.

Please remember the Woods branch parking lot off Mack Avenue is locked during drop-off (7:30-8:30 a.m.) and pick-up time (2:45-3:30 p.m.) for the safety of our children.

Our libraries, particularly the Woods branch, are busiest from 3:15-5:30 p.m., so it may be helpful for other patrons to visit at non peak hours.

Children under the age of 9 cannot be left unattended. Guardians or caregivers must be age 13 or above themselves to watch younger students in the library. The library staff is not responsible for supervision of your children. Childcare is available for a fee through the GPPSS Kids Club and details can be found at <a href="https://www.gpschools.org">www.gpschools.org</a> or by calling 313-432-3067.

### **Computer Use**

Students need a valid library card or knowledge of their card number to use computers.

Livetutor.com is available free of charge from 3-10 p.m. every day of the week.

Computer use is limited to 30 minutes to ensure equitable access.

Only one student is allowed to sit at a computer.

No food or drinks are allowed at the computer.

Students may bring their own earphones to use with computers; the library does not provide these.

Printing is available from youth computers for a small fee (10¢ per black and white page, \$1 for color).

#### **Working Together**

An expired library card or excessive fees may prevent patrons from using the computers or borrowing materials.

Any patron, including students, with a pattern of disruptive behavior will be banned from the library. To keep track of library usage in those busy times, student patrons will be asked to sign in for programming or quiet study using their library card.

Please remember, this is our community library. Working together, parents, students, community members, and library and school personnel will maintain a positive library environment and experience for all.
