PBIS-Positive Results

Now that the first semester and second card marking are coming to an end we look forward to reporting more positive results. Seven signatures in a student PBIS (Positive Behavior Intervention & Support) planner is the plateau number for an administrative intervention meeting. Eight signatures result in an office referral. As of 12/19/17, 98% of the student body at Brownell has maintained less than 7 signatures in the second quarter. The data demonstrates, once again, that the vast majority of students are consistently prepared and responsible for their own learning. It also indicates that nearly all students: arrive on time to class, complete their work, and behave according to Bronco Expectations throughout the school day. These results prove that the Bronco Nation continues to "Buck-Up" and improve.

Core Honors Courses

When scheduling, current sixth and seventh graders request elective courses, while the core academic courses are scheduled for them. Students who are currently successful in Honors courses will automatically be scheduled in Honors courses in that subject for next year. Current sixth graders will have the potential to qualify for two more Honors courses in seventh grade. Honors Science and Honors Social Studies are offered for seventh and eighth graders. Current sixth graders who qualify for Honors Science and/or Honors Social Studies will be notified by mail in May and will have the opportunity to elect those courses at that time.
