ATTENTION: FAMILIES OF FIFTH AND EIGHTH GRADE STUDENTS

Effective Immediately

The Board of Education feels strongly about enforcing our residency requirements and not opening our district to School of Choice options. Rather than incur the cost of a total district re-registration, the administration is performing a **total verification of students entering sixth and ninth grades**. Families who have already verified their address this school year due to an address change are exempt from this process.

At www.gpschools.org under Residency and Enrollment you will find more information about the documents required for this process. You must bring all the required original documents with you. We encourage you to come to the Administration Building at 389 St. Clair Avenue, Grosse Pointe before August 1. The office hours are: 8:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 8:00 a.m.-3:30 p.m. on Friday. Questions may be directed to Monica Ellerbee at 313-432-3083, option 2.

Class assignments <u>will not</u> be shared in August if you have not completed this residency verification process.

Please remember, that only one parent/legal guardian must reside within the district for their child to legally attend our schools. Students found to be attending without meeting residency requirements, are removed immediately.

This is one more method to assure our community that the children in our buildings are our students.
