The Day of the Dead (Día de Muertos) is a holiday celebrated mainly in Mexico and by people of Mexican heritage living in the United States and Canada. The holiday focuses on gatherings of family and friends to pray for and remember friends and relatives who have passed away. Traditions

include building private altars honoring the deceased, using sugar skulls, marigolds, and the favorite foods and beverages of the departed, and visiting graves with these items as gifts. The day is a celebration of the life of those we love, and a commitment to never forget.
